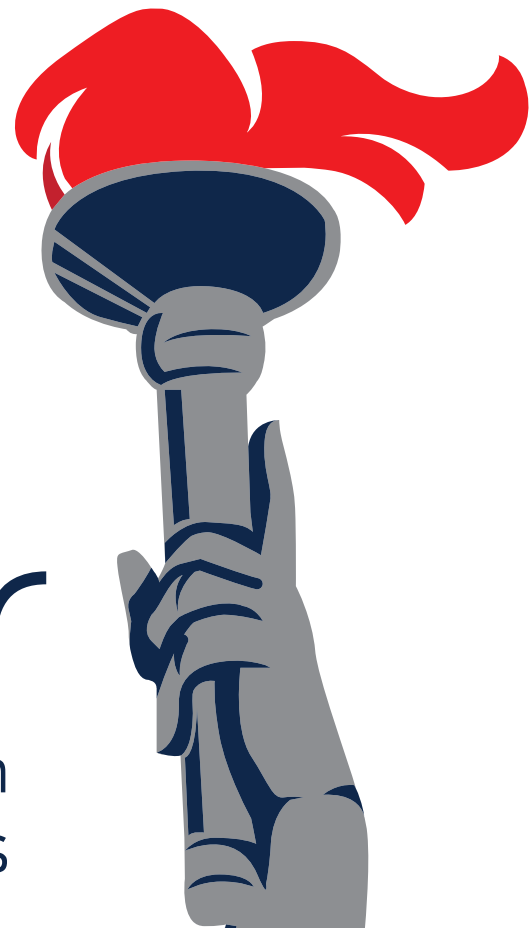

## New Programs to Help Us Reopen



We'll be launching a program to provide face coverings so that any Marion County resident who doesn't have a mask can get one free of charge.

## What's First to Open



*Nonessential retail stores* may reopen at 50% capacity in the store at a time and must observe social distancing.



*Restaurants* may open for outdoor seating with strict social distancing beginning Friday, May 22—with indoor seating at 50% possible as soon as June 1.



*Malls and individual retail stores within malls* may open at 50% capacity with appropriate social distancing. Movie theaters, salons, and gyms inside malls must remain closed. No inside dining is permitted at food courts, but carryout is permitted.



*Liquor stores* may reopen with 50% capacity at a time and must observe social distancing.



Salons, gyms, and museums must remain closed.
